<b>Intent</b>	<p>We want children to:</p> <p>Inspire pupils and develop their confidence, in order to value their creativity, whatever form that takes and however it manifests itself. We want them to be confident and unique artists, able to express their thoughts, moods, ideas and observations. We want children to appreciate a diverse range of great works of art.</p>
<b>Implementation</b>	<p>Using Access Art, all children from the very beginning of their primary school journey to year 6 develop creative and expressive skills and knowledge through 5 key concepts: line, colour, texture, form and space and shape. Children are encouraged to question and observe a focused stimulus which may take the form of a picture, sculpture, quality piece of text or music. They are given the opportunity to learn and practise skills by revisiting them and building on previous learning. Lessons are practical and encourage experimental and exploratory learning. Sketch books are used to record children's reflections and learning processes. Art specific vocabulary is a focus for all lessons and helps to ensure knowledge sticks.</p> <div style="display: flex; justify-content: space-around; align-items: center;">   </div>
<b>Impact</b>	<p>Produce creative work, exploring and recording their ideas and experiences. Be proficient in drawing, painting, sculpting and other art and craft and design techniques. Can evaluate and analyse creative works using subject specific language. Know about great artists and the historical and cultural development of their art. Meet the National Curriculum end of key stage expectations for art and design.</p>
