#### **End of EYFS**

### ELG:

- To state some similarities and differences between things in the past and now.
- To put two objects or events in order.
- To ask questions about artefacts from the past.

### End of Year 1

- To put a four objects or events in order.
- To name a few people in the past who have contributed to national and international achievements.
- To identify similarities and differences between the past and now.

## End of Year 2

- To identify similarities and differences between different times within living memory (since 1940).
- To name a few people in the past who have contributed to national and international achievements and to state their achievements.
- To analyse artefacts and sources to gain information.

#### End of Year 4

- To understand that the past is divided into differently named periods of time and use some dates to explain British, local and world history.
- To put artefacts or information in chronological order.
- To state a range of similarities/ differences between different times in the past in periods covered.
- To make connections & contrasts and some references in my work to concepts: cause & consequence, continuity & change, similarity, difference and significance
- To analyse sources effectively to gain information.

### End of Year 6

- To show a chronically secure knowledge and understanding of local, national and global history.
- To identify specific changes within and across different periods.
- To show an understanding of cause & consequence, continuity & change, similarity, difference and significance.
- To understand the complexity of people's lives in the past and how some societies are very different due to changes or challenges at the time.
- To evaluate and carefully select from a range of historical sources to find relevant historical information, considering different viewpoints or think about bias.
