National Curriculum

As Writers, we will be writing portal stories focusing on settings. Our model text is called 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. We will also be writing short pieces about Harvest.

As Readers, we will be reading extracts from many different books including;

- Rain Before Rainbows (full Picture Book).
- Indigo the Magic Rainbow Pony.
- Rainbow Street.

The children will also be hearing 'The Magic Finger' by Roald Dahl as a class text read to them by the teacher.

-As Mathematicians, we will begin by securing our number knowledge with place value. We will then move on to addition and subtraction skills. We will also be looking to improve our problem solving and reasoning skills.

As Scientists, we will learning how habitats such as oceans, coastal areas, woodlands and rainforests provide food and shelter for living things. The lessons introduce simple food chains to show how animals depend on one another for survival.

As Historians, we will compare schools now and in the past and develop a chronological understanding of 'within living memory' and 'beyond living memory'.

As Artists, we will be exploring drawing techniques linked to nature.

In P.E, we will be focusing on football skills and dance

In R.E., we will be exploring the question, 'Who is Muslim and how do they live?'
